THE MILLER FACULTY FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM: SUPPORTING IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY'S MOST INNOVATIVE AND ENGAGED TEACHERS

Executive Summary: The Miller Faculty Fellowship is an annual competitive grant program administered by the Iowa State University (ISU) Center for Excellence in Learning and Teaching. Since 1996, over 800 ISU faculty have enhanced undergraduate academic programs and developed innovative approaches to enrich student learning. Outcomes of the Fellowship include development of new courses, minors, and teaching environments, as well as overall improvement of faculty teaching. Many Miller Fellows leverage their projects into scholarly presentations, articles and additional granting opportunities, which directly aligns with the University's strategic plan. Dr. Marcketti will highlight some recent exemplars in this brief presentation.
