GENERAL

The Board of Regents, State of Iowa, held an electronic Board meeting on Saturday, February 23, 2002, commencing at 12:05 p.m., in accordance with §21.8 of the Iowa Code. The meeting was held via conference call because it was not practical to have the Regents assemble in one location for this brief meeting. Public access was provided at the following locations:

Following calling of the roll, President Newlin thanked everyone for participating in this meeting.

FY 2002 STATE BUDGET.

President Newlin said the purpose of this meeting was to clarify the Board's position on issues dealing with the FY 2002 state budget. Following the Board's telephonic meeting of February 20, 2002, there was confusion among state leaders about the Regents position on the use of the state's economic emergency fund. To clarify the Board's position, President Newlin said he would entertain a motion to adopt the following statement:

The Board supports utilization of state economic emergency funds to avoid further reductions in FY 2002 budgets for Regent institutions.

MOTION: Regent Turner moved to adopt the statement that

the Board supports utilization of state economic emergency funds to avoid further reductions in FY 2002 budgets for Regent institutions. Regent

Neil seconded the motion.

In response to President Newlin's request for questions or comments regarding the motion, Regent Kelly said he believes the State has known for over two years that there

was a severe financial problem in Iowa, and that there would be a continuing shortage of income for the next few years. In recognition of legislative discussion of using the "rainy day fund", he cautioned that, if the fund is used up, there will be nothing left for a "real" emergency in the future. He said that, in his opinion, in the last couple of years the State has spent money on unnecessary projects instead of cutting spending, all the while knowing that the State was faced with decreasing income. The State is now very short of money and is calling it an "emergency". By his definition, an emergency is, "an unforeseen combination of circumstances calling for immediate action". He expressed his opinion that this was not unforeseen and was, therefore, not an emergency.

Regent Kelly stated that, however, if the legislature does use the "rainy day fund", the Regents should get their fair share, so he reluctantly planned to vote "yes" to the motion. He concluded by stating that one of his primary responsibilities as a Regent is to assist the university presidents in reaching their goals.

VOTE ON THE MOTION: Motion carried unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT.
